I. Reports of Officers and Committees

Allen Pearce reviewed some of the major changes that have taken place in the organization since the February meeting. With the departure of Dan George, we divided his duties into three positions. Bids have been received and are in the process of being reviewed and ranked. FTR does have the capability to accept credit cards at the races now. There is a small fee involved so each club can decide if they want to use the service. We are working on setting up an option to pay for new memberships and renewals on-line, as well as banquet tickets. The new phone number for the FTR office is (352) 538-6291.

Jonny Simpkins presented a Profit and Loss from January to March, 2010. The line of credit is currently paid off. Jack Terrell also added that the FTR Benefit race held May 8-9, 2010, brought in approximately \$8,500 to the treasury.

Jack Terrell informed the BOD members that the Minor Release language did pass the legislature and is currently on the Governor's desk. In addition, the state has once again stripped the OHV Trust Fund of its unused funds.

George Tolson reported that the Enduro Series will end with 9 events. The final event will be held tomorrow, May 16, 2010, at Hart Island hosted by River City Dirt Riders. The series is down 2% – 3% in ridership but it has been a pretty good year overall.

Joe Steidl reported that the Hare Scramble series has ended. Thank you to all the clubs that helped with the Benefit Race. It has been a good season. We are planning on starting the next season off with a benefit race at Gatorback. We are still looking for volunteers for the Referee and Assistant Referee positions.

Carol Preston reported that she will be stepping down as chairman after this season. She introduced Ken Kloza who has agreed to take over the job pending approval. Numbers have been down this season about 34% due to two new series and the economy. The committee has some proposals to help alleviate these issues.

Carol Preston gave a brief overview of the banquet committee's progress. The flyer has been posted on the website. FTR will be selling tickets to be used for drinks at the banquet. These tickets will be counted toward the Food and Beverage minimums set in the contract with the hotel.

The meeting was adjourned and reconvened 10 minutes later.

After that time, a "B" rider accumulating 100 FTR advancement points will be allowed to compete for the remainder of that year in the "B" division. "A" and "B" FTR Hare Scrambles series and Motocross series riders will ride in the "B" enduro division. At the end of each season, a "C" rider will be promoted to the "B" division if the average of their year-end award scores

equals 60 or more points Average will be calculated only for those riders competing in three or more FTR championship events. A rider in this category will advance to "B" class regardless of their standing. Also any time throughout the year, if any "C" rider accumulates 15 or more FTR advancement points, they will be moved to "B" division immediately. Riders may reclassify themselves at any time to higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR scorekeeper. A rider can be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the endure committee. An A-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a B-rider will carry 50 promotion points to the new class, and a B-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a C-rider will carry 7 promotion points to the new class. The enduro committee has the authority to rescind (by majority vote) previous reclassification actions if a subsequent review of the rider's scores in the lower classification demonstrate that reclassification action was not warranted." change to read "This rule applies to displacement classes only. The specialty Advancement System is described in rule Chapter IV, paragraph B, 7. After that time, a "B" rider accumulating 100 FTR advancement points will be allowed to compete for the remainder of that year in the "B" division. "A" and "B" FTR Hare Scrambles series and Motocross series riders will ride in the "B" enduro division. If any "C" rider accumulates 15 or more FTR advancement points, they will be moved to "B" division immediately, any time throughout the season, taking 90% of their championship points to "B" division. Riders may reclassify themselves to higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR scorekeeper, and take 90% of their championship points any time before 50% of the sanctioned runs, but zero championship points after 50% of the sanctioned runs. A rider can be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the endure committee. An A-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a B-rider will carry 50 promotion points to the new class, and a B-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a C-rider will carry 7 promotion points to the new class. The enduro committee has the authority to rescind (by majority vote) previous reclassification actions if a subsequent review of the rider's scores in the lower classification demonstrate that reclassification action was not warranted." The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

George Tolson made a motion to accept the following Rule Change from the Enduro Committee: Chapter IV Enduro Rules, B. Classification of Riders, 7.g. "Riders may reclassify themselves at any time to a higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR Enduro Scorekeeper. A rider can only be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the Enduro Committee." change to read "Riders may reclassify themselves to a higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR Enduro Scorekeeper, and take 90% of their championship points any time before 50% of the sanctioned runs, but zero championship points after 50% of the sanctioned runs. A rider can only be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the Enduro Committee." The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

George Tolson made a motion to accept the following Rule Change from the Enduro Committee: Chapter V Enduro Scoring, C. Scoring, 12. "Women's Division: If this division is not required to negotiate the entire run, including all the checks, FTR points shall be awarded through the last check completed within the one-hour time limit. If a rider wishes to compete for maximum FTR points, she should ride the entire run. The trophies for the event will still be awarded to the best score for the required distance only. The disqualification rule after one hour and 59 seconds late to any check still holds for all classes." change to read "If a promoting club imposes a division cut off for Displacement, Specialty or Women's Classes. If a class division (A, B or C) are not required to negotiate the entire run during a specific event, including all the checks, full FTR position points shall be awarded only through the last check completed up to and including the cutoff point within the one-hour time limit for that class division. If a rider wishes to ride the entire run, beyond the required distance, that rider will not receive additional FTR position points. The trophies for the event will still be awarded to the best score for the required distance only. The disqualification rule after one hour and 59 seconds late to any check still holds for all classes and divisions." The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Ragan Dickson made a motion to accept the following Rule Change from the Motocross Committee: Chapter IX Motocross Rules, A. General, 7. "All riders are required to be FTR members. No exceptions." change to read "All riders are required to be FTR members which will include full FTR membership and one-day FTR membership which can only be used twice in a season." The motion was seconded and passed 17 For and 0 Against.

Ed Lukasovich made a motion to accept the following Rule Change from the Motocross Committee: Chapter X Motocross Scoring, B. Championship Points System, 3. "The last scheduled race of the season will be a Double Points event. In addition, each rider will be awarded five points for each race in which a rider participates as long as one gate start was completed. Participation points will be added to the year-end calculations even if competition points are dropped." change to read "The FTR Motocross Championship Series will consist of one double points event to be announced at the last scheduled event of the season. It will be announced at the riders meeting. In addition, each rider will be awarded five (5) points for each race in which a rider participates as long as one gate start was completed. Participation points will be added to the year-end calculations even if competition points are dropped." The motion was seconded and passed 17 For and 0 Against.

Joe Steidl made a motion to accept the following Rule Change from the Motocross Committee: Chapter III General Rules, H. Year-End Awards, 2.a. "Total points will be determined by the best combined scores in 70% of the events sanctioned by FTR. Rounding will be done to the nearest whole number with 0.50 being rounded up. To qualify for year-end awards in the FTR Series, a rider must enter at least 50% of the sanctioned events." change to read "Total points will be determined by the best combined scores in 70% of events sanctioned by FTR. Rounding will be done to the nearest whole number with 0.50 being rounded up. In addition, Motocross total points would be determined by the best scores in 80% of the events sanctioned by FTR. Rounding will be done to the nearest whole number also." The motion was seconded and passed 17 For and 0 Against.

Ford Snodgrass made a motion to accept the following Rule Change from the Motocross Committee: Chapter III General Rules, D. Rider Classification, 1. delete "Note 4: Riders in the +35C (No Jump) class may not ride another

Age/Veteran class in Motocross. The rider may ride in a C, Vintage, Evolution or Woods class." The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Ed Lukosavich made a motion to accept the following Rule Change from the Motocross Committee: Chapter XII Motocross Championship Series Classes, reads in part – "+25, +30, +35, +40, +45, +50, +16-34C (No Jump), +35C (No Jump), +16 (No Jump Expert)" change to read "+25, +30, +35, +40, +45, +50, Vet A, Vet B, Vet C". Add "Note 1: Vet C riders will be C level riders only. Riders will be watched closely and accumulation of 30 promotion points will promote the rider." The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.

Ed Lukosavich made a motion to accept the following Constitutional Change: Chapter I Constitution of the Florida Trail Riders, Article IX reads in part -

- 1. For the annual election, a request for nominations will be published in the FTR magazine and on the FTR website at least 60 days before the official ballot is published. Nominations must be sent to the Executive Director for inclusion on the official ballot. Nominations must be received by the Executive Director by the closing date of the October issue of the FTR magazine to be included on the official ballot. An official ballot will be inserted in the FTR magazine and on the FTR website at least 45 days prior to the end of the election month (October issue). It is recommended that the ballot be inserted in the election month issue of the magazine also.
- 2. The ballot in the FTR magazine will be an INSERT with the address the ballot is to be mailed to clearly indicated as agreed to by the Election Committee. The ballot on the FTR website will clearly indicate the address the ballot is to be mailed, as agreed to by the Election Committee. The official ballot must require the member's name, FTR number, and the member's signature. The only ballots accepted will be the official ballot mailed to this address, containing the required information and signed by the member.
- 3. The official ballot count will be made at the earliest opportunity following the last day of the election month. The FTR Executive Director will provide a current FTR membership list (as of the end of the election month). All ballots will be compared against the membership list for validity. Only members in good standing as of the election month will be allowed to vote. (Voting rights of members are indicated in Chapter II.) The Executive Director will be notified of the results immediately following the final vote count. It will be the duty of the Executive Director to publicize the election results.
- 4. In the event of a tie, a run-off will be held. The individuals with the 2 highest vote counts will be placed on an official ballot inserted into the FTR magazine in the subsequent month and on the FTR website. The candidate who garners the highest number of votes in the run-off will be considered the winner and will assume the position in question. Balloting procedures specified in paragraphs 2. and 3. above shall apply.
- 5. In the event that an elected position on the Executive Committee is unfilled due to the resignation, death, incapacity, or impeachment of an officer, a separate election will be held to fill the vacancy. Incapacity of an elected member of the Executive Committee may only be made by a two thirds majority vote of the Executive Committee. The Executive Director will publicize the vacancy, accept nominations, and place an official ballot in the immediately subsequent FTR magazine issue and on the FTR website calling for a vote by the general membership. Balloting procedures specified in paragraphs 2. and 3. above shall apply.
- 6. In the event an election is determined to be invalid, a new election month shall be declared by the Executive Committee and an official ballot shall be placed in the immediately subsequent FTR magazine issue and on the FTR website calling for a vote by the general membership. Balloting procedures specified in paragraphs 2. and 3. above shall apply.
- 7. With all elections, a direct mail-out of the official ballot by first class mail to the general membership may be substituted for the insertion of the official ballot in the FTR magazine. Said direct mail-out may only be done with approval of the Executive Committee.
- Protest of the results or validity of an election may only be made by a candidate for office and must be made no later than 10 days following notification of the results of the election. The protest must be in writing (email is acceptable) to the Executive Director. The Executive Director will immediately notify the Executive Committee of the protest. The Executive Committee will have 10 days to rule on the protest. change to read –
- 1. For the annual election, a request for nominations will be published in the FTR magazine and on the FTR website at least 60 days before the official ballot is published. - 3. The official ballot count will be made at the earliest opportunity following the last day of the election month. The FTR Secretary will provide a current FTR membership list (as of the end of the election month). All ballots will be compared against the membership list for validity. Only members in good standing as of the election month will be allowed to vote. (Voting rights of members are indicated in Chapter II.) The Secretary will be notified of the results immediately following the final vote count. It will be the duty of the Secretary to publicize the election results.
- 4. In the event of a tie, a run-off will be held. The individuals with the 2 highest vote counts will be placed on an official ballot included in the FTR magazine in the subsequent month and on the FTR website. The candidate who garners the highest number of votes in the run-off will be considered the winner and will assume the position in question. Balloting procedures specified in paragraphs 2. and 3. above shall apply.
- 5. In the event that an elected position on the Executive Committee is unfilled due to the resignation, death, incapacity, or impeachment of an officer, a separate election will be held to fill the vacancy. Incapacity of an elected

member of the Executive Committee may only be determined by a two thirds majority vote of the Executive Committee. The Secretary will publicize the vacancy, accept nominations, and place an official ballot in the immediately subsequent FTR magazine issue and on the FTR website calling for a vote by the general membership. Balloting procedures specified in paragraphs 2. and 3. above shall apply.

- 6. In the event an election is determined to be invalid, a new election month shall be declared by the Executive Committee and an official ballot shall be placed in the immediately subsequent FTR magazine issue and on the FTR website calling for a vote by the general membership. Balloting procedures specified in paragraphs 2. and 3. above shall apply.
- 7. With all elections, a direct mail-out of the official ballot by first class mail to the general membership may be substituted for the inclusion of the official ballot in the FTR magazine. Said direct mail-out may only be done with the approval of the Executive Committee.

Protest of the results or validity of an election may only be made by a candidate for office and must be made no later than 10 days following notification of the results of the election. The protest must be in writing (email is acceptable) to the Secretary. The Secretary will immediately notify the Executive Committee of the protest. The Executive Committee will have 10 days to rule on the protest.

The motion was seconded and passed 17 For and 0 Against.

Brooks Tomblin discussed ideas to help expand the Enduro series within Florida including encouraging more clubs hosting events on private land with multiple loops and developing more opportunities for our youth. Jack Terrell informed the BOD that the online ATV safety class meets the state requirements for the kids. Brooks suggested that a committee be formed to expand the series within the state. Allen Pearce asked Brooks to put a group together and he would officially appoint the committee.

Carol Preston presented ideas that the Committee Chairmen have been discussing about a bonus system to encourage more crossover between the three series.

Ragan Dickson discussed a Good Samaritan Rule idea that she received from a member.

Ed Lukosavich moved that we adjourn the Board of Directors meeting. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 12:45 PM.

The President called the Sanction Meeting to order and determined a quorum was present at 2:10 PM.

The 2010-2011 sanctions were scheduled. There were 15 Hare Scrambles, 12 Motocross, and 9 Enduros placed on the schedule. Joe Steidl made a motion to accept a sanction for a Benefit Race as the 15th Hare Scramble on February 5 & 6, 2011 pending approval of the rulebook changes at the General Membership Meeting. The motion was seconded and passed 17 For and 0 Against.

George Tolson made a motion to adjourn the Sanction Meeting. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously.
