## I. Reports of Officers and Committees

Randy Faul reported that disqualifications will be handed out next season for non-compliance of the sound rules. Clubs will be required to provide several people to help with the sound testing at their event. Florida is working on legislation with similar sound limits so FTR is ahead of the game. The Quad Scrambles series was a little slow to gain momentum this past season. On another note, everyone is not a racer. Maybe FTR needs to look at a Fun Run Series. The banquet is coming up in August with a new chairperson, Donna Hazeltine. Please help her in any way you can.

Allen Pearce reported that the finances are improving. The first four months of 2006 have shown great improvement due to the membership fee changes. The accounting for the Land Use Fund will be separated from the General Fund to give a clearer picture of our true finances.

Jim Wilder reported that he has joined the OHV Advisory Committee. Jack Terrell helped him with the process. He has attended several meetings and is familiarizing himself with Land Use issues in Florida. There is a lot of grant money out there that is not being utilized. He presented Jack Terrell's Land Use Report. Jack reported on the status of the National Forest trails, grants that have been awarded and Florida legislation pertaining to OHV recreation.

Sam Mento reported that the Enduro Committee had a very good meeting. DDR presented the committee with a letter about the Alligator Enduro sanction. The committee discussed a Junior Enduro series and will be putting a proposal together during next season. An Enduro Benefit Race is being added to the schedule for next season. The majority of the races are in-state and there are 3 new races on the proposed schedule.

Joe Steidl reported that the Hare Scrambles series is going strong. George Pollard has stepped up to fill the Referee position and there is a strong candidate for scorekeeper. The main focus will be sound - testing and enforcement.

Dave Hall reported the Motocross series is doing well. They are going to try some fundraising activities next season.

Amanda Fronckowiak reported that the Quad Scrambles series has put together a 1-day format that will help the series grow. Mark Campbell could not be here because his wife just had a baby. Congratulations!

## II. Unfinished Business

The motion passed unanimously and will be presented for final ratification at the General Membership meeting.

Allen Pearce made a motion to accept the following rule change: Chapter III, General Rules, F. Year-End Awards, 2. Winners for the Year. Add "g. Year-end awards will not be given for Quad classes in the Hare Scrambles series." Also, add to the end of 4. "Quad classes in the Hare Scrambles series will not be allotted any year-end trophies." The motion passed and is now final.

Allen Pearce made a motion to accept the following rule change: Chapter III, General Rules, H. Fees, " 1 . The FTR sanction fee for Enduros $\$ 200$. The FTR sanction fee for Hare Scrambles and Quad Scrambles is $\$ 700$." Change to " 1 . The FTR sanction fee for Enduros and Quad Scrambles is $\$ 200$. The FTR sanction fee for Hare Scrambles is $\$ 700$." The motion passed unanimously and is now final.

Allen Pearce made a motion to accept the following constitutional change: Chapter I, Article IV thru VII Article IV, add to end of article "To qualify for office, the President shall have been a member of FTR in good standing for a minimum of 3 years at the time of election to office." Article V, add to end of article "To qualify for office, the Vice President shall have been a member of FTR in good standing for a minimum of 2 years at the time of election to office." Article VI, add to end of article "To qualify for office, the Secretary shall have been a member of FTR in good standing for a minimum of 2 years at the time of election to office." Article VII, add to end of article "To qualify for office, the Treasurer shall have been a member of FTR in good standing for a minimum of 2 years at the time of election to office." The motion passed unanimously and will be presented for final ratification at the General Membership meeting.

Allen Pearce made a motion to accept the following constitutional change: Chapter I, Article X, paragraph $4,2^{\text {nd }}$ sentence "The quorum required for all committees and Board of Directors meetings shall be twothirds of the members." Change to "The quorum required for all committees and Board of Directors meetings shall be $50 \%$ of the members except for the Executive Committee which will be two-thirds of the members. The motion passed unanimously and will be presented for final ratification at the General Membership meeting.

Allen Pearce made a motion to accept the following rule change: Chapter III, General Rules, I. Riders and Eligibility, 3. $1^{\text {st }}$ sentence "All entrants to an FTR event will be FTR members and, as such, will conduct themselves as responsible motorcyclists." Change to "All FTR members attending or participating in any FTR event will conduct themselves as responsible motorcyclists." The motion passed unanimously and is now final.

Allen Pearce made a motion to accept the following constitutional change: Chapter I, Article XV Bylaws, "III. Dues and Sanction Fees shall be:" Rename to "III. Dues, Sanction Fees and Head Tax:" The motion passed unanimously and will be presented for final ratification at the General Membership meeting.

Allen Pearce made a motion to accept the following constitutional change: Chapter I, Article XV Bylaws, III. Dues and Sanction Fees shall be: "D. At all FTR events, all participants are required to be a current FTR member except as stated below. FTR sanction events are open to all qualified FTR members. AMA membership will be required at dual sanction (FTR-AMA) events. At other dual (FTR-SE\&TRA) events, a rider must be a member of at least one of the sanctioning organizations. However, if they are a Florida resident as described above they must be an FTR member." Delete this item. Rename E. to D. Also, Chapter III, General Rules, I. Riders and Eligibility, 1. "FTR-sanctioned events are open to all qualified FTR members. AMA membership is not required. At dual-sanctioned enduros, a rider must be a member of one of the sanctioning organizations. However, if they are a Florida resident as described in Article XVI, \#III, D they must be an FTR member." Change to "FTR-sanctioned events are open to all qualified FTR members. Current FTR membership is required of all participants except multi-sanctioned enduros. At multi-sanctioned enduros, all participants must be a member of one of the sanctioning organizations, except Florida residents who must be a current member of FTR. AMA membership is not required at any event unless the event is AMA sanctioned and AMA membership is required by the promoting club." The motion passed unanimously and will be presented for final ratification at the General Membership meeting.
