2009-2010 Rule Book

Chapter IV Enduro Rules, Section B. Classification of Riders. Paragraph 3. Page 13.

Current Rule:

3. This rule applies to displacement classes only. The specialty Advancement System is described in rule Chapter IV, paragraph B, 7. Any time before 50% of the sanctioned runs, any "B" rider accumulating 100 FTR advancement points will be advanced to "A" division immediately. After that time, a "B" rider accumulating 100 FTR advancement points will be allowed to compete for the remainder of that year in the "B" division. "A" and "B" FTR Hare Scrambles series and Motocross series riders will ride in the "B" enduro division. At the end of each season, a "C" rider will be promoted to the "B" division if the average of their year-end award scores equals 60 or more points. Average will be calculated only for those riders competing in three or more FTR championship events. A rider in this category will advance to "B" class regardless of their standing. Also any time throughout the year, if any "C" rider accumulates 15 or more FTR advancement points, they will be moved to "B" division immediately. Riders may reclassify themselves at any time to higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR scorekeeper. A rider can be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the enduro committee. An A-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a B-rider will carry 50 promotion points to the new class, and a B-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a C-rider will carry 7 promotion points to the new class. The enduro committee has the authority to rescind (by majority vote) previous reclassification actions if a subsequent review of the rider's scores in the lower classification demonstrate that reclassification action was not warranted.

Proposed New Rule

3. This rule applies to displacement classes only. The specialty Advancement System is described in rule Chapter IV, paragraph B, 7. Any time before 50% of the sanctioned runs, any "B" rider accumulating 100 FTR advancement points will be advanced to "A" division immediately, **taking 90% of their championship points to "A" division.** After that time, a "B" rider accumulating 100 FTR advancement points will be allowed to compete for the remainder of that year in the "B" division. "A" and "B" FTR Hare Scrambles series and Motocross series riders will ride in the "B" enduro division. **If any "C" rider accumulates 15 or more FTR advancement points, they will be moved to "B" division immediately, any time throughout the season, taking 90% of their championship points to "B" division. Riders may reclassify themselves to higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR scorekeeper, and take 90% of their championship points any time before 50% of the sanctioned runs, but zero**

championship points after 50% of the sanctioned runs. A rider can be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the enduro committee. An A-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a B-rider will carry 50 promotion points to the new class, and a B-rider reclassified (by enduro committee vote) as a C-rider will carry 7 promotion points to the new class. The enduro committee has the authority to rescind (by majority vote) previous reclassification actions if a subsequent review of the rider's scores in the lower classification demonstrate that reclassification action was not warranted.

Chapter IV Enduro Rules, Section B. Classification of Riders. Paragraph 7, G, page 14.

Current Rule:

7. The Specialty Classes Ranking System for promoting and demoting riders in the Vet, Senior, Super Senior, and Master classes at the end of each season is defined as follows:

g. Riders may reclassify themselves at any time to a higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR Enduro Scorekeeper. A rider can only be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the Enduro Committee.

Proposed New Rule

7. The Specialty Classes Ranking System for promoting and demoting riders in the Vet, Senior, Super Senior, and Master classes at the end of each season is defined as follows:

g. Riders may reclassify themselves to a higher (but not lower) division by notifying the FTR Enduro Scorekeeper, **and take 90% of their championship points any time before 50% of the sanctioned runs, but zero championship points after 50% of the sanctioned runs.** A rider can only be reclassified to a lower division by petitioning the Enduro Committee.

Current Rule:

12. Women's Division: If this division is not required to negotiate the entire run, including all the checks, FTR points shall be awarded through the last check completed within the one-hour time limit. If a rider wishes to compete for maximum FTR points, she should ride the entire run. The trophies for the event will still be awarded to the best score for the required distance only. The disqualification rule after one hour and 59 seconds late to any check still holds for all classes.

Proposed New Rule:

12. If a promoting club imposes a division cut off for Displacement, Specialty or Women's Classes. If a class division (A, B or C) are not required to negotiate the entire run during a specific event, including all the checks, full FTR position points shall be awarded only through the last check completed up to and including the cut off point within the one-hour time limit for that class division. If a rider wishes to ride the entire run, beyond the required distance, that rider will not receive additional FTR position points. The trophies for the event will still be awarded to the best score for the required distance only. The disqualification rule after one hour and 59 seconds late to any check still holds for all classes and divisions.

Chapter V, Enduro Scoring, Section C, Scoring, #14, Page 16

Current Rule:

14. A team shall consist of not less than three riders nor more than five riders. Riders may compete on only one team. They must be entered as a team before the meet begins. The best three scores will be used to determine the winning team for that event. In case of a tie, the 4th and 5th place riders placing will be used to determine the team winner. If still tied after the 5th person, the raw scores of each team rider will be added and the lowest team total wins. A team competing for a year end award shall remain consistent in its members. An eight member roster must be registered with the Enduro Scorekeeper. A minimum of any three, or a maximum of any five of these members, may enter an event. A team roster can only be changed in the event that the member(s) being deleted from the

team is unable to compete in 3 or more of the remaining events for the season. Roster changes must be submitted in writing to the Enduro Scorekeeper.

Proposed New Rule:

14. Rosters/Teams: A roster of three (3) to a maximum of eight (8) members must be registered with the Enduro Scorekeeper before the first event begins. Each member must sign the roster agreeing to be on the team. A minimum member roster may be increased at any time thereafter to the maximum of eight (8) members. A member may be deleted after such member has missed three (3) events and may be replaced at anytime thereafter. Roster changes must be submitted in writing to the Enduro Scorekeeper before the affected meet begins. A team shall consist of not less than three (3) nor more than five (5) members from the roster. Riders may compete on only one (1) team. They must be entered as a team before the meet begins. The three (3) best placed riders will be used to determine the winning team for that event. In case of a tie, the 4th placed rider, and subsequently the 5th placed rider, will be used to determine the winning team. If still tied after the 5th rider, the event will be deemed a tie with both teams receiving equal points.
