Proposal 1/24

A motion was brought by the chairman to modify the top 10 AA advancement rule to exclude all age specific classes.

. AA Class: The top ten A/AA riders from the previous season (as long as they have met the Championship requirements of their

respective class), (excluding age specific classes), any rider with an over-all win in the previous season, any FTR AA Enduro rider, AA riders from any other

organization, any nationally ranked AA hare scramble or Enduro rider, or any current national or professional moto crosser. Any AA

FTR Hare Scramble or Enduro past champion may, for his/her lifetime, ride as an AA Rider. Any AA FTR Hare Scramble or Enduro

rider that has earned AA status up to 3 years prior to the current season may ride AA class. Utility quads may run in the AA Class,

but once the rider goes to the AA Class, they must appeal to the Hare Scramble Committee to move to any other class. The

Competition Chairman and/or referee may approve riders requesting AA the day of the event. And once a person rides AA, he must

ride AA class for the remainder of the season

I would like to address a concern regarding the current class structure for women participating in the Hare Scrambles events. Racing on the Sunday course, which is a longer distance with more challenging terrain, poses safety risks for women riders who may not yet have the necessary skills and experience to navigate such a demanding course.

To rectify this issue, I propose the addition of a dedicated women's class on Saturdays ("Women C"), specifically designed to accommodate the skill progression of beginner women riders. This new class would provide a suitable platform for them to further develop their skills, gain confidence, and gradually adapt to the demands of more challenging courses.

Additionally, the addition of a "Women C" class on Saturdays provides equal opportunities for women riders to compete and progress in a safe and supportive environment. I believe this change will enhance the overall experience for female participants and contribute to the safety and success of the FTR Hare Scrambles series
